Open every day of the year, the UMHCC provides an alternative to presenting at hospital Emergency Departments for a mental health crisis.

Using a combination of peer-led recovery and clinical support, we provide evidence-based, high-quality urgent mental health support.

How to access the Urgent Mental Health Care Centre

People in Adelaide seeking urgent mental health support can arrive at the UMHCC at 215 Grenfell Street from 12 pm until 10:30 pm each day, including weekends and public holidays.
